#### **Trash Sticker Information**

Beginning August 6, 2021, the Town will be implementing a freemium trash sticker program for the residential curbside trash collection service. This means each household will receive a predetermined number of stickers (for no cost) at the beginning of the year and more can be purchased from Town Hall if needed. One (1) town trash sticker must be affixed to the "neck" of a sealed trash bag.

- Use one sticker for one 33-gallon trash bag or two 16-gallon kitchen trash bags. Contractor bags are not allowed.
- The maximum weight for one sticker is 35 pounds of trash.
- If the weight exceeds 35 pounds then an additional sticker must be attached.
- Each household is receiving 104 trash bag stickers directly mailed to each residence. Additional stickers can be requested in person at Town Hall. The Town reserves the right to limit additional stickers per household.



TRASH ONLY. NO recyclable materials, metals or yard waste. 1 sticker per 33-gallon bag OR 2 16-gallon bags. Not to exceed 35 pounds per sticker. Bags exceeding weight limit will require additional stickers. For more information, visit our website - www.erving-ma.gov

# Recycling

Recycling is required and mandatory in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. All glass, metal, plastic, paper, including cardboard, are prohibited from trash disposal and must be recycled. Almost 50% of household trash can be recycled. You can recycle the following materials:

- ✓ Paper (clean paper only)
- ✓ Newspaper
- ✓ Cardboard (please flatten boxes)
- ✓ Plastics (containers smaller than 2.5 gallons)
- ✓ Glass
- ✓ Tin, steel and aluminum
- ✓ Milk and juice cartons
