NEW AND REVISED TOWN BYLAWS

BYLAW EDITORIAL CHANGES

The Town Clerk, or an agent designated by the Town Clerk, shall be authorized to make non-substantive editorial revisions of the Town general bylaws to ensure consistent and appropriate sequencing and numbering, including but not limited to the following actions:

- 1. Assign appropriate numbers to sections, subsections, paragraphs and subparagraphs
- 2. Reassign appropriate numbers to sections, subsections, paragraphs and subparagraphs
- 3. Formatting changes such as spacing, capitalization, font size, underlining or italics
- 4. Correct internal cross-references
- 5. Spelling

The assignment of such corrections shall be identified by a footnote or functionally similar editorial convention.

CABLE ADVISORY COMMITTEE BYLAW

1. Authority, Establishment; Members; Appointment

In accordance with Massachusetts General Law Chapter 166A, there is hereby established a Cable Advisory Committee ("Committee") comprised of three (3) members. The members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Select Board, which serves as the appointing authority of the Committee and the Issuing Authority for all cable franchise licensing agreements on behalf of the Town

2. Terms of Office

Committee members shall serve three (3) year terms which shall be staggered. All subsequent appointments shall be for a three-year term commencing on July 1. In the case of a mid-term vacancy, the appointing authority shall select a new member for the remainder of the unexpired term and may re-appoint that person or select another for the term beginning July 1.

3. Duties

The Committee shall have the following duties to support the Select Board in the implementation of the license:

- Inform and educate the public about cable television service;
- Assess the cable needs of the community and recommend policy changes;
- Conduct regular meetings with cable company representatives to discuss matters of mutual interest;
- Report to the Select Board on company compliance with the license;
- Supervise the cable operator's response to complaints;

- Respond to residents' questions regarding the cable television system;
- Keep abreast of community programming issues;
- Management of the Public, Educational, and Governmental (PEG) Access fund;
- Develop policies and operating procedures for PEG access television, with approval from the Select Board;
- Advises on issues related to the operation of PEG access television, in concert with the Town Administrator, and other subsequent staff and vendors contracted to provide related services, in support of the recording and broadcasting local government meetings, fostering the production of local events, and making production technology and training available to the public;

MEETING MINUTE REQUIREMETS BYLAW

Section 1. Scope

This Minutes Bylaw shall apply to every Board, Committee or Commission whether elected or appointed and whether permanent, standing or special. Throughout the rest of this bylaw the term Board shall be used with the understanding that it also applies to a Committee or Commission, whether elected or appointed.

Section 2. Annual Board Organization

Every board shall annually in July select a chair, a clerk or secretary, and such other officers, if any, as the board shall deem necessary. The clerk or secretary may, but need not, be a member of the board.

Section 3. Minutes Content Requirements

Every board shall conduct its meetings in accordance with the Open Meeting Law of the Commonwealth, MGL Chapter 30A, Sections 18 to 25 as amended from time to time. It should be noted that the Open Meeting Law requires the following minimum information to be included in the minutes of any meeting:

- the date, time and place of the meeting;
- the members present or absent;
- a summary of the discussions on each topic;
- the decisions made and actions taken, including a record of all votes;
- a list of all documents and exhibits used at the meeting;
- the name of any member who participated in the meeting remotely;
- if any members participate remotely all votes must be rollcall votes. 940 CMR 29 10(7)(b)

Section 4. Filing Of Minutes

The clerk or secretary shall keep accurate minutes of each meeting of the board, whether a regular, special or emergency meeting and shall file the minutes with an ink signature of the board clerk or secretary with the Town Clerk within ten (10) days following their approval by the board. The Town Clerk or his designee shall post the minutes on the town's website. Boards are expected to approve all minutes at the next regular meeting, but in any case, minutes are to be approved within 45 days unless regular meetings are more than a month apart in which case the minutes will be approved at the next regular meeting.

Section 5. Executive Session Minutes

Executive session minutes need not be filed with the Town Clerk until such time as the reason for the executive session is no longer valid. Boards should regularly review executive session minutes to determine if the stated reason for the executive session is no longer valid, but in any case, executive session minutes are to be reviewed annually in June of each year at a minimum. Executive Session minutes are to be reviewed and released for the public under the provisions of the Open Meeting Law of the Commonwealth, MGL Chapter 30A, Sections 18 to 25 as amended from time to time.

Section 6. Disposition Of Minutes Prior To Effective Date of This Bylaw

Every board shall file a copy of all minutes held in their custody that were created prior to the enactment date of this bylaw with the Town Clerk within six months of said enactment date.

Revolving Fund By-Law

DEPARTMENTAL REVOLVING FUNDS

- 1. <u>Purpose.</u> This by-law establishes and authorizes revolving funds for use by town departments, boards, committees, agencies or officers in connection with the operation of programs or activities that generate fees, charges or other receipts to support all or some of the expenses of those programs or activities. These revolving funds are established under and governed by General Laws Chapter 44 § 53E1/2.
- 2. <u>Expenditure Limitations.</u> An authorized department or agency head, board, committee or officer may incur liabilities against and spend monies from a revolving fund established and authorized by this by-law without appropriation subject to the following limitations:
 - A. Fringe benefits of full-time employees whose salaries or wages are paid from the fund shall also be paid from the fund (except for those employed as school bus drivers.)
 - B. No liability shall be incurred in excess of the available balance of the fund.
 - C. The total amount spent during a fiscal year shall not exceed the amount authorized by this by-law, or town meeting on or before July 1 of that fiscal year, or any increased amount of that authorization that is later approved during that fiscal year by the Selectboard and Finance Committee.
- 3. <u>Interest.</u> Interest earned on monies credited to a revolving fund established by this by-law shall be credited to the general fund.
- 4. <u>Procedures and reports.</u> Except as provided in General Laws Chapter 44 §53E1/2 and this by-law, the laws, by-laws, rules, regulations, policies or procedures that govern the receipt and custody of town monies and the expenditure and payment of town funds shall apply to the use of a revolving fund established and authorized by this by-law. The Town Accountant shall

include a statement on the collections credited to each fund, the encumbrances and expenditures charged to the fund and the balance available for expenditure in the regular report the town accountant provides the department, board, committee, agency or officer on appropriations made for its use.

5. <u>Authorized Revolving Funds.</u> The Table establishes:

- A. Each revolving fund authorized for use by a town department, board, committee, agency or officer.
- B. The department or agency head, board, committee or officer authorized to spend from each fund.
- C. The fees, charges and other monies charged and received by the department, board, committee, agency or officer in connection with the program or activity for which the fund is established that shall be credited to each fund by the Town Accountant.
- D. The expenses of the program or activity for which each fund may be used.
- E. Any restrictions or conditions on expenditures from each fund.
- F. Any reporting or other requirements that apply to each fund, and
- G. The fiscal years each fund shall operate under this by-law.

Cemetery

We have limited available plots left at Erving Center Cemetery so we are beginning to analyze Town-owned parcels to see if they have the appropriate soils and access to create a new cemetery

Church Street & North Street

The Highway Department has purchased temporary speed humps – the gentler cousin of speed bumps – to install on Church St and North St at approximate locations identified at a May neighborhood meeting. They can be pulled up to accommodate winter plowing and the goal is to see if they reduce traffic speeds effectively and inform more permanent options for the future.

Senior Housing

The Senior Housing Committee has released a Request for Proposals from developers due this fall. This project aims to build long-anticipated affordable senior housing on Care Drive in an effort to allow Franklin County seniors to stay in the area they love.

Swamp Road Bridge

Geotechnical work is underway and a grant application has been submitted to MassDOT. A public input session will be scheduled for the fall.

Wheelock Street Culverts

One of the two culverts scheduled to be replaced in this project started to fail in June – luckily a contractor was already lined up to start work the first week in July. Work is under way and the new culverts will be sized appropriately for increased capacity and allow wildlife to move through them. Both design & construction were funded by grants.



ERVING PUBLIC LIBRARY RECEIVES NATIONAL GRANT FOR SMALL AND RURAL LIBRARIES \$20,000 Grant Will Help the Library Work with Residents Who Identify as Neurodivergent

Erving, MA — Erving Public Library (EPL) has been selected as one of 240 libraries to participate in Libraries Transforming Communities (LTC): Accessible Small and Rural Communities, an American Library Association (ALA) initiative that provides community engagement and accessibility resources to small and rural libraries to help them better serve people with disabilities.

The competitive award comes with a \$20,000 grant that will help the library work on better serving local patrons who identify as neurodivergent. The term neurodivergent often refers to disabilities and different kinds of communication or cognitive functioning including but not limited to autism spectrum disorder, ADHD, dyslexia, learning disabilities, anxiety, depression, bipolar, dementia, and Alzheimer's. Patrons at EPL who identify as neurodivergent have requested services and socialization activities. The library is committed to using the LTC grant to increase access to library facilities, services, and programs to better serve people in this population. It is the hope of Assistant Director Jean Daley to reach residents in need and to widen the geographic range of the library's service population by doing outreach and site visits to day programs.

As part of the grant, EPL staff will take an online course in how to lead conversations, a skill vital to library work today. Staff will then host conversations with residents about being neurodivergent, what services the population needs, and use the grant funds to bring the identified services to this population. Some possible programs include monthly socials and take-home packages with soothing and educational activities.

Community Conversations are scheduled for Tuesday, August 22, 11:30am-12:30pm at the Erving Senior and Community Center, Wednesday, August 23, 10:30am-11:30pm at the Erving Public Library, and Thursday, August 24, 5:30pm-6:30pm, at the Erving Public Library. Food will be provided at all events. Since 2014, ALA's Libraries Transforming Communities initiative has re-imagined the role libraries play in supporting communities. Libraries of all types have utilized free dialogue and deliberation training and resources to lead community and campus forums; take part in anti-violence activities; provide a space for residents to come together and discuss challenging topics; and have productive conversations with civic leaders, library trustees and staff.

Libraries Transforming Communities: Accessible Small and Rural Communities is an initiative of the American Library Association (ALA) in collaboration with the Association for Rural and Small Libraries (ARSL).

ANNUAL HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DAY

Franklin County Solid Waste District is planning to hold the 2023 household hazardous waste collection on Saturday, September 23rd at GCC's Main Campus and the Orange Transfer Station.

Residents and businesses must pre-register by September 15th. Online pre-registration for the 2023 collection will open on August 16, at: franklincountywastedistrict.org. Mail-in registration forms will be available in mid-August at town transfer stations and in local newspapers.

Participants will be assigned an appointment time to bring wastes to the collection; an appointment time and instructions will be provided by mail after registration is processed.

The collection is free for residents of most of the District's 21 member towns. Businesses may participate but must pay for disposal costs. For business registration information, call (413) 772-2438.

This collection provides an opportunity to dispose of hazardous items that should not be put in the trash, such as leftover oil-based paints, stains, thinners, pesticides, herbicides, pool chemicals, motor oil, antifreeze, household cleaners, and other household chemicals. A more complete list of acceptable items is at: franklincountywastedistrict.org.

Batteries and mercury-containing items such as fluorescent light bulbs, thermometers, and thermostats will not be accepted at this collection. These items, which may contain mercury or heavy metals, should never be put in trash or recycling. Handle carefully, bring them to a municipal transfer station or a <u>Regional Hazardous Waste "Super Site"</u> and hand to attendant. In addition, fluorescent light bulbs are accepted at Lowe's Stores (all types of fluorescents), and Home Depot (CFLs only).
