LAST DAY TO REGISTER TO VOTE FOR PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY

The last day to register to vote for the upcoming Presidential Primary on March 5, 2024, is Saturday February 24, 2024. You can register to vote at the Town Hall, 12 East Main Street, Erving, MA from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. on that day or any day before then that the Town Hall is open.

PLEASE NOTE: If you wish to vote by mail, your application must be received in the Town Clerk's Office by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday February 27, 2024. Furthermore, all ballots must be returned to the Town Clerk's Office by 8:00 on Tuesday March 5, 2024. If there is not enough time to get it here by return mail, then you must drop it off either in the Town Clerk's Office or in the drop box by the parking lot door entrance. It is your responsibility to make certain the ballot is received on time. Late ballots will not be counted.



Board & Commission Vacancies January 2024

Cable Advisory Committee (Three (3) vacancies)

Crving needs you!

The Cable Advisory Committee is charged with the responsibility to assess local cable needs, monitor company compliance with the contract, make recommendations to the licensing authority (the Select Board) regarding contract terms, develop policies and procedures regarding the Public, Educational, and Government access channel to support the recording and broadcasting of local meetings and events. The Cable Advisory Committee shall be comprised of three appointed members.

Conservation Commission (One (1) vacancy)

The Conservation Commission is tasked with enforcing the Wetlands Protection Act in Erving. Often this is referred to as "wetlands permitting" or environmental permitting". The Commission also oversees the Town's conservation land and hiking trails at Poplar Mountain Conservation Area and supports pollinator education at Erving Elementary School.

Council on Aging – (Three (3) vacancies)

Councils on Aging & Senior Centers provide support services to elders, families, and caregivers in the community. As a local agency, the Councils on Aging & Senior Centers serve as an elder advocate, offers services, and activities for elders. Council on Aging offerings may include Outreach, Transportation, Meals (congregate or home delivered), Health screenings, Health insurance counseling, Socialization, Fitness, wellness and recreation activities, Life-long learning. They serve as a link to and support for elders. Each Council on Aging determines its own priorities based on local needs and resources. Senior centers are a welcoming place for older adults who wish to remain independent in their community.

Cultural Council - (Two (2) vacancies)

Cultural Council members are appointed by the Select Board. The local Cultural Council supports public programs that promote access, education, diversity and excellence in the arts, humanities, and interpretive sciences in communities across the Commonwealth. Local decision-making is an integral element of this system. Local councils have the right and responsibility to award grants that address cultural needs specific to their communities, and they can decide how to distribute funds if the state policies outlined in these regulations and supplementary guidelines are followed. They meet 2-4 times per year.

Finance Committee - (One (1) Vacancy)

The Finance Committee is a five-member committee, primarily responsible for submitting its recommendations on the annual budget to the town meeting. The Committee is commonly involved in the preparation process of the development of the budget and the establishment of guidelines for departments. Their statutory authority is limited to making transfers from the Town's reserve fund to other line items in the budget as requested.

Historical Commission (Two (2) vacancies)

The Historical Commission is charged with the preservation, protection, and development of the historical or archeological assets of the Town. As such, they make recommendations to the Select Board on matters relating to the preservation, protection and development of historic areas, buildings, structures, and sites. Further, it may acquire in the name of the Town by gift, purchase, grant, bequest, devise, and lease or otherwise the fee or lesser interest in real or personal property of significant historical value and may manage the same.

Zoning Board of Appeals (one (1) vacancy)

The ZBA is charged with making Zoning text and zoning map interpretations, hearing appeals of administrative decisions, and to grant variances from ordinance standards where there is practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship meeting ordinance standards.



Elected Official Vacancies for the School Committee & Recreation Commission

The Town of Erving would like to announce one (1) vacancy on the Recreation Commission and one (1) vacancy on the School Committee. These vacancies are for elected positions. In accordance with MGL Chapter 41, Section 11, the Select Board is seeking interested residents to serve in these positions until the Annual Town Election in 2024. To be considered, an interested person must be a registered voter of the Town of Erving.



The **School Committee** is a five (5) member elected Board that establishes educational goals and policies for Erving Elementary School consistent with the requirements of the law. Each member is expected to attend all meetings and participate in subcommittees. Members are also encouraged to attend the Union 28 District quarterly meetings.



The **Recreation Commission** is a five (5) member elected Board that provides youth sports, recreational programs, and special events for Erving residents. The Commission does so while overseeing the use and development of the Town's five (5) parks and playgrounds.

If you are interested, please send a written letter of interest that identifies the position that you are interested in serving in and that includes your name, address, and contact information. It may be helpful to include an explanation of your education, training, experience, and other interests that would lend itself to the position sought.

As reminder Massachusetts allows residents to burn brush between January 15 and May 1, depending on weather conditions. You must obtain permission from the Fire Department or http://www.fcburnpermits.com/. The permits are free of charge, but availability depends on weather conditions.

Regulations

- You may only burn BRUSH! All other materials are illegal. No leaves, grass, hay, stumps, building debris or any other materials are allowed to be burned.
- All open burning must be a minimum of 75 feet from buildings or structures.
- Burning will be allowed to start at 10:00am and must be extinguished by 4pm.
- Any open fire must be attended at all times by the permit holder.
- No person shall set, maintain, or increase a fire in open air at any time except by permission.
- You must be 18 years or older to apply for a permit and/or set, maintain, or increase fire once permission has been granted by the Fire Department.
- You must have an appropriate means to extinguish an open-air fire completely at the end of the day or if requested by the Fire Department.
- The Fire Department can refuse or cancel a permit at any time. (Example: Violation of permit regulations or change in weather conditions.)
- Open burning season is January 15 May 1.
- Massachusetts Regulation 310 CMR: DEP 7.07 "Open Burning"

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING DATES:

Nomination papers can be picked up in the Town Clerk's Office anytime, but must be returned to the Town Clerk's Office no later than March 18, 2024. There must be 20 valid signatures of registered voters in the Town of Erving to place your name on the ballot. It is recommended that you obtain extra signatures in the event that someone signs that is not a registered voter, which is a very common occurrence.

The Annual Town Elections will be Monday May 6, 2024 with the polling hours from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Erving Town Hall, 12 East Main Street. The last day to apply for a vote by mail ballot is May 1, 2024, and the returned ballot must be received before the close of polls on May 6, 2024.

The Annual Town Meeting will be Wednesday May 8, 2024 with the location and starting time to be set by the Select Board.

It's that time of year

Remember that per the bylaws of the Town of Erving, private property owners are responsible for clearing the abutting sidewalk of snow, ice, or sleet to full width, within 24 hours of the snow event ceasing. If a fire hydrant is located adjacent to a private Property, the owner is responsible for clearing the hydrant of snow, ice, and sleet to a width of two (2) feet.

Per State Law and the bylaws of the Town of Erving, it is unlawful for any person to place snow or ice upon public property, including public streets.
Furthermore, cleared snow shall be piled and accumulated in a manner that does not block the visibility of drivers on public streets and alleys or cause other hazardous conditions.

House Numbers

Seconds Count in an Emergency

Protect your family and your property by having large visible house numbers.
 Firefighters, police officers, and paramedics find you faster when your home is properly marked.
 A visitor, child or injured person may be unable to give clear directions.
 Emergency personnel from a neighboring community may be unfamiliar with your area.

Use Large Visible Numbers

• Numbers need to be at least 4 inches in height and facing the street. • Put the numbers under lighting, and use numbers with a contrasting background, so they will be visible at night. • Be sure to use the E-911 address for the property. • If your driveway is long, post your house number on both sides of a mailbox or sign pole at the end of the driveway near the road. • Be sure to keep numbers visible by trimming trees and bushes.

It's the Law

• Massachusetts General Laws C. 148, S. 59. specifies that every building in the state must have visible address numbers posted.

In accordance with Town of Erving bylaws, property owners are responsible for clearing sidewalks and fire hydrants, that are adjacent to their properties, within 24 hours of the end of a snowstorm.

Please note that the bylaw does provide for a penalty for property owners that do not cooperate.

Greetings from the Tax Collector's Office

Mark your calendars for April 1, 2024, the due date for taxes.

The FY 24 Second Half Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were mailed on December 28, 2023.

Payments can be made anytime online at https://unipaygold.unibank.com/ enter "Town of Erving – Collector" and hit the "GO!" button.

You have two (2) options for paying your bill; either by electronic check or by credit card.

Electronic Check:

You will need one of your checks with you when you pay your bill online to get your account number and the bank's routing number from it. You will be shown where this information is on your check. There will be a \$0.50 cart processing fee assessed for all electronic check payments.

Credit Card:

We accept MasterCard, Visa, American Express and Discover for credit card payments. There will be a convenience fee for each online payment. The credit card service provider charges the fee to your credit card. When paying by credit card, the fee amount will appear in a separate box and will be totaled with the amount of the tax. Erving Elementary School

Preschool and Kindergarten Registration

Erving Elementary School is beginning to register preschool and kindergarten aged students for the 2024-2025 school year.

<u>Preschool</u>: If you have a child who will be 3 or 4 years old by September 1, 2024 and you live in the town of Erving, they are eligible to attend preschool at Erving Elementary School.

Erving Elementary offers a full day preschool program - Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday 8:50-3:00 and Wednesday 8:50-1:00. *First Year (3-yr old program) students do NOT attend preschool on Wednesday. Preschool is a tuition-based program per the Erving School Committee. We charge \$20 per day for preschool tuition.

<u>Kindergarten</u>: If you have a child who will be 5 years old by September 1, 2024, and you live in the town of Erving, he/she is eligible to attend kindergarten at Erving Elementary School.

**Students currently attending Erving Elementary School are automatically enrolled for their next school year.

All registration packets are due by March 11, 2024

I imagine myself restricted to a walker, meeting with some Elementary School kids while I'm at the Senior Center for one of the many events and having them share with me the current Story Walk. Or, living in Erving Center and being able to take a wheelchair down to Riverside Park and going along the river on an accessible path.

These ideas continue to come to my mind, and I have mentioned them to others in town government, but I wonder if they are shared concerns. Projects like these take outside grants, supported by numbers of individuals in the community who share the concern. If you are one who also would like to work towards these goals, let me know.
