The following Boards and Committees have vacancies:

• **Cultural Council** – (One vacancy)

Cultural Council members are appointed. The local Cultural Council supports public programs that promote access, education, diversity and excellence in the arts, humanities, and interpretive sciences in communities across the Commonwealth. Local decision-making is an integral element of this system. Local councils have the right and responsibility to award grants that address cultural needs specific to their communities, and they can decide how to distribute funds if the state policies outlined in these regulations and supplementary guidelines are followed. They meet 2-4 times per year.

Planning Board Alternate

Planning Board Members are elected, but the alternate is an appointed position. The Planning Board is charged with overseeing and guiding development in the community. The Planning Board reviews permit applications for subdivisions and some special permits, and it is designated as the authority for Site Plan Review permits.

• Council on Aging – (Three vacancies)

Councils on Aging & Senior Centers provide support services to elders, families, and caregivers in the community. As a local agency, the Councils on Aging & Senior Centers serve as an elder advocate, offers services, and activities for elders. Council on Aging offerings may include: Outreach, Transportation, Meals (congregate or home delivered), Health screenings, Health insurance counseling, Socialization, Fitness, wellness and recreation activities, Life-long learning. They serve as a link to and support for elders. Each Council on Aging determines its own priorities based on local needs and resources. Senior centers are a welcoming place for older adults who wish to remain independent in their community.

Zoning Board of Appeals (One vacancy)

The ZBA is charged with making zoning text and zoning map interpretations, to hear appeals of administrative decisions, and to grant variances from ordinance standards where there is practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship meeting ordinance standards.

June 2023 Updates From the Town Planner

Church Street Bridge

Our engineers are working with MassDOT on design approval to be eligible for funding. In May, a neighborhood conversation about traffic and speeding on North Street was held to identify concerns and discuss potential improvement measures which could be implemented before or after bridge construction.

Former IP Mill

A community discussion regarding tax override funding options for the demolition of the Former IP Mill was held in April. Thank you to everyone who came out to share your thoughts! The Select Board, Finance Committee, and Capital Planning Committee continue to discuss next steps.

French King Bridge

The safety barriers on the north side of the bridge have been completed and work has commenced on the south side.

Senior Housing

The Senior Housing Committee hopes to release a Request for Proposals for senior housing behind the Library and Senior Center

Swamp Road Bridge

After many months of researching property deeds the feasibility study continues to move forward with soil borings and surveying work.

Wheelock Street Culverts

We received a grant to upgrade two culverts on Wheelock Street. Work began in May and will continue into the summer.

Zoning Bylaw Update

The Planning Board has been diligently working with an attorney to draft updates to the Town's Zoning Bylaws. One public hearing was held in April, a few more changes were made and another public hearing is scheduled for June 15 at 7PM at the Library.

NOTICE REGARDING FY 2024 PRELIMINARY TAXES

Taxpayers of Erving: The Town of Erving recently adopted, at its annual town meeting on May 11, 2022, a new semi-annual preliminary tax payment system to take effect for July 1, 2023. The information below explains how this new system will work.

How Preliminary Tax Payments System Will Work

Under the preliminary tax payment system, you will be sent a preliminary tax bill each year by August 1. Your preliminary tax will be based on the adjusted net tax owed (including any betterment, special assessments and other charges added to the tax) on your property for the prior fiscal year and as a general rule will be no more than half (50%) of that amount. Your preliminary tax will be payable in a single installment due on October 1.

Example: If your Fiscal Year 2023 tax was \$2,000 and you were granted an abatement of \$400, your FY2023 net tax due was \$1,600. Your Fiscal Year 2024 preliminary tax would in most instances be no more than \$800. This \$800 would be payable in a single installment due on October 1, 2023.

If for some reason preliminary tax bills were mailed after August 1, you would have until November 1 (or 30 days after the bills are mailed, if later) to pay the entire \$800.

Your actual tax bill will then be sent to you on or about December 31. This bill will show the assessed valuation of your property, the tax rate, and the amount of property taxes you owe for the fiscal year, including any betterment, special assessments or other charges that are added to the tax. The tax bill will also show the amount of the preliminary tax billed earlier as a credit against your actual tax for the year. The balance of your tax must be paid by April 1.

Example: If your actual Fiscal Year 2024 tax bill is \$2,100 and you had previously been billed \$820 in preliminary taxes for the year, you would have a remaining balance of \$1,280. This \$1,280 balance would be payable on April 1, 2024.

If for some reason actual tax bills were mailed after December 31, you would have until May 1 (or 30 days after the bills are mailed, if later) to pay the entire balance of \$1,280.

Late Payments

Under the preliminary tax payment system, interest on late tax payments will be charged for the number of days that the payment is actually delinquent. For example, if the actual tax is due on April 1 and it is not paid in a timely manner, interest will be charged from that date until the date the payment is made.

Abatement Applications

Under the preliminary tax payment system, abatement applications for real and personal property cannot be accepted by the Board of Assessors until the actual tax bill has been issued. The abatement application will be due no later than April 1st. Please note that the Erving Board of Assessors does not accept electronic copies of abatement applications. They must be the original form and have an original signature.

Exemption Applications

Under the preliminary tax payment system, exemption applications may be accepted by the Board of Assessors Office after July 1st but will not be processed until the actual tax bills have been issued. They will be due no later than April 1st. Please note that the Erving Board of Assessors does not accept electronic copies of exemption applications. They must be the original form and have an original signature.

WATER SOURCES AND SYSTEM OVERVIEW

We're pleased to present to you, this year's Consumer Awareness Report for our monitoring period Jan. 1, 2022 to Dec 31, 2022. We want to keep you informed about the excellent water and services we have delivered to you over the past year. Our goal is and always has been to provide safe and dependable supply of drinking water.

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radio-active material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Contaminants that may be present in source water before we treat it include:

Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.

Inorganic contaminants, (such as salts and metals) which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm-water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining or farming. Pesticides and herbicides may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture

and residential uses.

Radioactive contaminants are naturally occurring.

Organic chemical contaminants including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals. These are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production. They can also result from gas stations, urban storm-water runoff, and septic systems.

Groundwater is the source for the Erving Water Department. Well #1 is located off of River Road, which is an aquifer formed by a deep, narrow buried river valley. This is an ancient location of the Connecticut River Valley (pre-glacial). The well and storage tank were constructed and brought on line in 1983 and was recently recoated inside and out in the Fall of 2009. Many drinking water sources in New England are naturally corrosive (i.e. they have a pH of less than 7.0). For this reason, it is beneficial to add chemicals that make the water neutral or slightly alkaline. The Erving Water Department adds sodium hydroxide to its water to adjust the water to a noncorrosive pH.

The Water Department has a source Water Assessment Plan, a Well Head Protection Plan, and an Emergency Response Plan. In addition, Erving's Board of Health has adopted a floor drain regulation for the Zone II area of the well.

The Erving Water Department maintains a cross-connection and back flow testing and surveying program on an on-going basis. In our continuing efforts to maintain a safe and dependable water supply, it might be necessary to make improvements to our water system. The costs of these improvements may be reflected in the rate structure. Rate adjustments may be necessary in order to address these improvements.









HEALTH TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS

In the table you will find many terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. To help you better understand, we've provided the following definitions:

- Maximum Contamination Level or MCL: The highest level of a contaminant in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to MCLGs as feasible using the best available technology.
- Maximum Contamination Level Goal or MCLG: The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.
- Non-Detects (ND): Laboratory analysis indicated that the constituent is not present.

- Action Level (AL): the concentration of a contaminant which, when exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.
- ♦ n/a: not applicable
- nd: not detectable at testing limit
- ppb: parts per billion or micrograms per liter
- ppm: parts per million or milligrams per liter
- pCi/I: picocuries per liter (a measure of radiation)

"MCLs are set at very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described for many regulated constituents, a person would have to drink two (2) liters of water everyday at the MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

NEWLY REVISED FEDERAL LEAD AND COPPER RULE



If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The Erving Water Department is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at https://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead.

WE HAVE MET THE REQUIREMENTS AND ARE PRESENTLY IN A REDUCED SAMPLING AND TESTING SCHEDULE, THIS INCLUDES FIVE SAMPLES FROM THE SYSTEM EVERY THREE YEARS.

The system was chlorinated and the re-sampling showed no coliform bacteria. DEP has prepared a Source Water Assessment Program (SWAP). FEDERAL AND STATE REQUIREMENTS


In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) prescribe regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The food and Drug Administration (FDA) and Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water that must provide the same protection for public health. All drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

CONTAMINANTS

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immunecompromised individuals (cancer patients undergoing chemotherapy, organ transplant recipients, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders), some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. 




