MARK BLATCHLEY FOR SCHOOL COMMITTEE

My name is Mark Blatchley and I want to be elected to the school committee. I have been involved in education as a teacher for just over 51 years before retiring. I was a Science Teacher and Outdoor Program Leader primarily with Adolescents with various Special Needs in different settings.

In addition to the numerous IEP meetings I was involved in representing not only program but also the individual student who I saw (and still see) as not just a set of test scores and diagnosis but as a complex human being with strengths as well as areas of difficulties.

I worked for a few years after retiring as a substitute para and a few times as a Special Ed teacher in Union 28 schools; primarily in the 4th, 5th and 6th grades. I was working in Erving, 6th grade, on the day we put notices in student boxes informing parents that school would be closed due to the pandemic.

Besides my penchant for seeing youth in a holistic way I also belief Erving has always had an excellent school staff and see no reason it should not continue to do so within a supportive community.

I value education programs that involve all aspects of a community, that connect students with the natural world, with the arts, the world of work and that meet the pace and strengths of each student.

While personally being opposed to the high stakes testing program mandated by the Department of Education it is a given that we need to work with until it is changed. Along those lines I already express my opinions to legislators on matters in education I believe in. Currently I am writing and encouraging others to write to state representatives and senators in support of SD938 which would require two educators and a school committee member be appointed to the Board of Education (currently they are prohibited).

I'm happy to talk to anyone regarding education in general and our schools in particular.

March on Poplar Mountain

Spring has been in the air since early February so there is no telling what you'll find while hiking on the Conservation Land. There may be snow, ice, mud or dry ground. If you can get out in the morning you'll catch more birds; maybe even some returning migratory types. If there is snow look for tracks. Bobcat, Rabbit, Squirrels, Porcupines, Fisher as well as previous hikers all leave their signs along the way. This is also the time for activity in the vernal pools up where the Yellow Trail crosses the powerlines. On a 40 degree night watch for frogs and salamanders crossing from woodlands to ponds. Farley Road in Wendell can get covered with them. If you pick them up to move them off the road (I always do) take them in the direction they were going.

The Conservation Commission is sponsoring a hike led by Adam Kohl of Wendell on Sunday March 26th and entitled <u>Plants and Insects of Late Winter.</u> I expect to see the first Skunk Cabbage and buds on the trees for sure.



The purpose of the program is to provide income-eligible homeowners with interest-free loans to correct health and safety code deficiencies and improve the energy efficiency of their homes.
