ALMOST ANYTHING GOES

Erving's Annual Bulky-waste Curbside Collection Program

Casella Waste Management will begin collection on

Monday, May 01, 2023 approximately 7:00 AM.

Accepted Items:

Bulky furniture: couches, futons, chairs, tables, etc.

Note: The metal frame in sleeper sofas must be separated from the rest of the couch



- Scrap metal, such as bicycle frames, empty containers, and posts
- Scrap wood- length and width should not exceed 4' x 4'
- Small appliances, such as vacuum cleaners, toasters, etc.

Important: Items must be sorted into safe, organized piles with metal separate from general refuse.

Items that Cannot be Accepted

- Household trash & loose trash
- Construction debris, such as sheetrock, tile, framing, roofing, concrete, masonry, etc.
 Note: If you need a building permit to have conducted the work, this material should have been collected in a dumpster
- Vehicles & parts such as cars, boats, snowmobiles, and parts of these items



- Small engines such as lawn mowers, etc.
- Yard waste such as grass clippings, branches, stumps
- Tires
- Televisions & white good appliances, such as refrigerators, freezers, stoves, dishwashers, etc.
- Mattresses & box springs
- Hazardous materials of any kind

Q: What can and cannot be collected through the Almost Anything Goes program?

A: The list above is a general guide of what can and what will not be accepted curbside for collection. If residents have specific questions about what is acceptable, please call Glenn McCrory at (413) 423-3500 ext. 1400.

ALMOST ANYTHING GOES

Erving's Annual Bulky-waste Curbside Collection Program

Program Description: The program is only for residential bulky waste items that cannot otherwise be collected with household trash or that can be disposed of at the Highway Department. Items must originate from households in Erving. The collection will begin on the Erving-side of town and move eastwardly until complete.



Program Goals: The Town of Erving provides this service to the residents to achieve the following goals:

- Reduce illegal dumping
- Improve the health and safety of residents

Additional Frequently Asked Questions

Q: When can I begin placing items curbside for collection?

A: You may place items curbside for collection starting on **Saturday, April 22, 2023,** only. Items placed out earlier will be considered illegal dumping.

Q: Where exactly can I place my items for collection?

A: Items must be placed curbside on your property for collection. Items cannot be placed on the street, sidewalk, or blocking a fire hydrant. **Important**: Items must be sorted into safe, organized piles with metal separate from general refuse. Please remember that these materials must be picked up by someone by hand.

Q: I missed the 1st day of collection, and my street has been collected, will they come back if I put my items out now?

A: Unfortunately, no, once the collection team has passed your house they cannot return for collection.

Q: What do I do if someone has placed items on my curbside that are not mine?

A: Items left by someone other than the homeowner will be considered illegal dumping and will result in a fine of up to \$3,000.00. If you believe that illegal dumping has occurred, please call the Erving Police Department at (413) 423-3310.

Spring 2023 "Clean Sweep" Bulky Waste Recycling Day

Franklin County Solid Waste Management District is holding the Spring 2023 "Clean Sweep" Bulky Waste Recycling Day on Saturday, May 13 from 9 a.m. to noon. The three drop-off sites are: Mohawk Trail Regional School at 26 Ashfield Rd. (Route 112 South); Northfield Highway Garage at 49 Caldwell Rd; and Whately Transfer Station at 73 Christian Lane.

Residents from any District town may bring bulky items such as tires, appliances, scrap metal, furniture, carpeting, construction debris, computers, televisions, propane gas tanks, and other large items. Materials will be recycled whenever possible.

Mattresses and box springs will not be accepted at this event. In 2022, the Solid Waste District established five permanent drop off locations for mattress recycling across the county. See this webpage for locations, pricing and hours: franklincountywastedistrict.org/mattress-recycling. Call the District office at 413-772-2438 if you are unsure if your mattress and box spring can be recycled.

There are charges for most items. Disposal fees, cash only, will be collected during check-in at each site. A complete list of prices for the most common items is at: franklincountywastedistrict.org. The price list will also be provided to participating town halls and transfer stations. Residents and businesses do not need to pre-register for the collection.

Electronics are accepted at the event, but residents are also encouraged to recycle computer equipment and televisions at their town's transfer station, or at Greenfield Transfer Station. Staples stores accept computer equipment (no TVs) free of charge: call your local store for details.

Clean, dry textiles and books will be accepted for free reuse or recycling. Textiles must be contained inside a sturdy plastic bag. Textiles are now banned from the trash. Textile recycling accepts 95% of all textiles, including clothing or linens that are torn, stained, with missing buttons or broken zippers. Damaged textiles can be sold to manufacturers that make insulation or shop rags. Acceptable items include CLEAN & DRY clothing, shoes, and accessories; plus curtains, sheets, towels and stuffed animals in any condition (except moldy or wet). Books can be in any condition (except moldy or wet) and can be hardcover or paperback. No encyclopedias.

Bulky Rigid Plastics will be collected separately for a special recycling program; \$5 per load. Acceptable items for this special recycling program are limited to these items only: 5-gallon pails, plastic lawn furniture, plastic trash barrels, recycling bins, laundry baskets, storage totes, and milk crates. Bulky rigid plastic items must be empty.







Conservation Commission News by Mark Blatchley

I'm just back from showing our May trip leader, Ernie LeBlanc; around a portion of the Poplar Mountain Conservation Area. Our May hike on the 21st will start at 7:30AM and will be a bird hike. Now I'm no 'birder', and 7:30 is a bit early for me to hit the woods these days. But the birds are out there and that is a good time. When I'm putting out the feeders here (I take them in each night; bears, you know) at my house in Farley at 6:30 in the morning the sounds of my impatient guests are everywhere and loud. So, join us at 7:30 in the morning at the parking lot on Old State Road on Sunday May 21st to learn what birds are taking up residence, staking out turf and passing through our hillside. When I went out with Ernie, we didn't go 100 feet without hearing and identifying another bird, starting with a Pine Warbler right from the parking lot.

I've also been out a couple of times with friends, a neighbor of the land and even my dog Ruggles to find some of the remaining marked bounds of the conservation area in preparation for a partial redo of the survey of the land. If you ever find a pipe, rebar, or other stake in the woods, do not move it. The surveyor should be working on Poplar Mtn in late May or June. We don't encourage off trail wandering but having done a lot of it in my day, it is interesting what you can see. Getting lost is always a concern and as Daniel Boone once said, "I've never been lost, but I was a might bewildered once for two or three days."

The trails are all in good shape at this point and our next event after this hike will be a roadside cleanup. If you can get out on Poplar Mountain do so, report any obstructions on the trails, register at the kiosk, walk close to it so the trail counter counts you and check for ticks when you leave.

Building season is starting and if you have a project in mind for this year, please contact the Conservation Commission early on. Many questions can be easily answered prior to the need for filing forms. We endeavor to make the process as straightforward as possible while still protecting our state's wetlands, streams, and rivers. The area of jurisdiction is 100 feet from the Bordering Vegetation of a Wetland or 200 feet from a River or Stream. The commission meets in the Erving Library the first Tuesday of every month at 6pm.
