What:

The leaf collection program is a free service for Erving residents. Leaves should be raked into piles along the curbside.

The Department begins collection on Erving-Side and will continue east through town. The Department works as quickly as possible, but depending on several factors, the collection could take up-to two (2) weeks to complete.

Important: The Department asks that residents ensure

that leaf piles <u>do not</u> include sticks, pet waste, garden waste, glass, or any other household waste. Piles that include these waste items will not be collected.



Sticks and other items can clog the collection unit and damage the equipment. Pet waste is a biological hazard that should be disposed of through other means. This collection is only for tree leaves.

Lastly, please do not block sidewalks, fire hydrants, or create piles in the roadway.





News from the Assessor's Office

New Assessor:

We wanted to welcome our new Assessor Erik Eichorn. Erik joined the board after the resignation of Jeffrey Rollins, who moved out of Erving. Welcome Erik! He joins the board which includes Daniel Hammock and Mark Burnett.

Tax Bills:

Additionally, FY2023 tax bills will be issued in December. The Assessor's Office recently upgraded our assessing CAMA software, replacing software that was over 20 years old and becoming obsolete. However, this upgrade has not been as trouble free and smooth as we had hoped, and it is still in process, to be completed by the end of October. We will then begin the tax rate setting process.

Home values/Strong Sales Market:

Please note that, as most people are aware, the cost of buying a home increased substantially these past 12 months. We are required to analyze all the valid sales from the preceding year (2021) to ensure that our assessed values are within a certain range of the sale prices. This is called the assessment to sales ratio, and our values must fall between 90% - 110% of those sale prices. With the incredibly strong real estate market, that means for most of us, our assessed values will go up this year. If your property assessment increases, does that mean your taxes will increase? Not necessarily. It depends on the town's total valuation for all properties and how much voters raise and appropriate at our Annual and Special Town Meetings.

Tax Pre-Payment Option:

If you wish to pay your FY2023 tax bill early, you may do so. The Tax Collector can take pre-payments of taxes with the authorization of the Board of Assessors. It is suggested that if you wish to send in your pre-payment to use the amount that you paid in May of 2022. You may also call the Tax Collector or the Assessors Office for help.

TOWN OF ERVING NEEDS YOU!



The following Boards and Committees have vacancies:

Historical Commission – (Two vacancies)

Historical Commission members are appointed. The Historical Commission has the statutory responsibility to work towards the preservation, protection, and development of the historical or archeological assets of the Town. The Commission also has the responsibility for the collection housed at the Pearl B. Care Building in Erving Center.

Cultural Council – (One vacancy)

Cultural Council members are appointed. The local Cultural Council supports public programs that promote access, education, diversity and excellence in the arts, humanities, and interpretive sciences in communities across the Commonwealth. Local decision-making is an integral element of this system. Local councils have the right and responsibility to award grants that address cultural needs specific to their communities, and they can decide how to distribute funds if the state policies outlined in these regulations and supplementary guidelines are followed. They meet 2-4 times per year.

• Golden Cane Committee – (Two vacancies)

Golden Cane Committee members are appointed and is charged with researching, in collaboration with the Town Clerk and vital records information, to find the eldest living Town resident and presents that individual(s) with a Golden Cane Certificate. The committee is currently down to one member and this tradition cannot carry forth without having three (3) members.

• Cable Advisory Committee – (Three vacancies)

Cable Advisory Committee members are appointed and the committee is charged to: 1)assess local cable needs, 2)monitor company compliance with the contract, 3)solicit and review proposals from cable companies, 4)negotiate contracts with cable providers in the best interest of the community in terms of programming, cost to consumer, and amenities provided to the municipality and schools, 5)make recommendations to the licensing authority (the Select Board) regarding contract terms, and 6)obtain community input in fulfillment of "Municipal Ascertainment" guidelines of the Massachusetts Cable Television Division.

What is Co-Response?

Erving, Gill, Northfield, Bernardston, Leverett, Leyden, Warwick & Wendall police departments joined together to provide a more proactive response to calls involving mental health concerns by embedding a full-time, master-level clinician through the local nonprofit behavioral health agency Clinical & Support Options (CSO). Our clinician, Leeanne Hadsel is dispatched with an officer to provide expertise in the areas of emotional & mental health as well as behavioral de-escalation.

The purpose of the program seeks to expand the community conversation about mental health resources and enable individuals to get the help they need, avoiding unnecessary hospitalizations and involvement in the criminal justice system. As an added benefit, our in-house clinician provides staff education opportunities on different facets of mental health. So far, we've seen an approximate 87% diversion rate from costly emergency room assessments and unnecessary incarcerations!

Our co-responder, Leeanne, has 10 years of behavioral health experience and a doctorate in behavioral neuroscience. She originally hails from the region, having grown up in Warwick and attending Pioneer and NMH. Leeanne feels very personally connected to this area and has a vested interest in bettering our community.

The scoop of the day

On September 29, we held our second *Coffee with Cops* at the Erving Senior Center. One great question, what is Shelburne Control? As many of you know the Police Department doesn't have someone in the station answering phone calls because we're out on the road. Shelburne Control is our regional dispatch center. They supply services for a portion of, & in most cases all the needs of 25 towns & 62 agencies in Franklin County.

Their dispatch duties include answering non-emergency calls, enhanced 911, & dispatching appropriate services including police, fire, ambulance, public works, & ancillary services. For Emergencies dial 911. Non-emergency, to speak with an officer dial 413-625-8200. Either way Shelburne Control will assist you.

Another issue is speeders. We receive complaints all over town. Your calls are logged, & the information goes out to the on-duty officer. We also work hand in hand with our local Highway Dept. & MASS DOT regarding the speed signs. Police can provide traffic enforcement but can't install items on the roadways.

We were also asked if the speed sign on Northfield Rd. just south of the Senior Center could be fixed. The next day, Glenn from our Highway Dept. advised the unit is once again operational. Thank You!







The Friends hold an annual plant and book sale to support various library programs and events. Seasonal raffles are held to raise money for library events and programs.

Yearly activities the Friends support include: monthly craft day, summer reading program prizes and events, and the annual pumpkin painting event. Regional Mattress Recycling Program Begins October 24th

The Franklin County Solid Waste Management District is working with five towns to accept clean and dry mattresses and box springs for recycling. This program is open to residents in all District towns. The program is <u>only</u> for clean and dry fabric covered mattresses and box springs, including foam and crib mattresses.

Beginning on October 24th residents must take clean and dry mattresses and box springs to a recycling program in Bernardston, Colrain, Deerfield, Montague, or Wendell. The MassDEP now prohibits all clean and dry mattresses and box springs from going into the trash for landfill disposal and these will be rejected if brought to a transfer station for disposal.

All regional mattress recycling sites charge \$35 per mattress or box spring regardless of size. Check the specific information for each site before bringing a mattress for recycling.

Site addresses, hours, and payment information is below:

Bernardston Transfer Station, Nelson Rd, Thursday and Saturday 7 am – 5 pm. Checks only. Colrain Transfer Station, Charlemont Rd, Saturday 8 am – 4 pm. Cash or checks. Deerfield Transfer Station, Lee Rd., Tuesday, Thursday, & Saturday 8:30-4. Checks/money order. Montague Transfer Station, Sandy Lane Turners Falls, Wednesday 7-2:30 Saturday 7-12. Checks only. Wendell Transfer Station, New Salem Rd., Tuesday 12-5:50 & Saturday 7:30-3:30. Cash or checks.

Franklin County residents can also use the Greenfield Transfer Station on Cumberland Rd, which is open Tuesday through Friday 11-2:30 and Saturday 7:30-2. Mattresses and box springs cost \$30 each plus a \$5 host fee for out of town residents.

Shopping for a new mattress? Ask your mattress seller if they will take away your old mattress when they deliver the new one. Some retailers will include this service as part of the delivery, and some charge a fee.

District towns include Bernardston, Buckland, Charlemont, Colrain, Conway, Deerfield, Erving, Gill, Hawley, Heath, Leverett, Montague, New Salem, Northfield, Orange, Rowe, Shelburne, Sunderland, Warwick, Wendell, and Whately.
