Elected Official Vacancies for the Planning Board & Recreation Commission

The Town of Erving would like to announce one (1) vacancy on the Recreation Commission and one (1) vacancy on the Planning Board. These vacancies are for elected positions. In accordance with MGL Chapter 41, Section 11, the Select Board is seeking interested residents to serve in these positions until the Annual Town Election in 2024. To be considered, an interested person must be a registered voter of the Town of Erving.



The **Planning Board** is a five (5) member elected Board that guides the development of Erving by serving as the Special Permit and site plan review authority under the Zoning Bylaw. The Board also administers the provisions of the Subdivision Control regulations. The Planning Board plays an important role in reviewing the Zoning Bylaw, proposing edits, and holding public hearings for voters before any revisions are presented at Town Meeting.



The **Recreation Commission** is a five (5) member elected Board that provides youth sports, recreational programs, and special events for Erving residents. The Commission does so while overseeing the use and development of the Town's five (5) parks and playgrounds.

If you are interested, please send a written letter of interest that identifies the position that you are interested in serving in and that includes your name, address, and contact information. It may be helpful to include an explanation of your education, training, experience, and other interests that would lend itself to the position sought.

Letters of interest are due by Wednesday, October 25, 2023.

Board & Commission Vacancies September 2023

Cable Advisory Committee (Three (3) vacancies)

Crving needs you!

The Cable Advisory Committee is charged with the responsibility to assess local cable needs, monitor company compliance with the contract, make recommendations to the licensing authority (the Select Board) regarding contract terms, develop policies and procedures regarding the Public, Educational, and Government access channel to support the recording and broadcasting of local meetings and events. The Cable Advisory Committee shall be comprised of three appointed members.

Cemetery Commission (Three (3) vacancies)

The Cemetery Commission's responsibilities shall include, but shall not be limited to, the operation of the Town of Erving cemeteries, to advise the Select Board on the staffing required for the care of the cemeteries, divide land into lots, and to sell and issue deeds for the right of burial. The Cemetery Commissioners shall be authorized to establish rules and regulations and to determine fees, as may be amended from time to time.

Council on Aging – (Four (4) vacancies)

Councils on Aging & Senior Centers provide support services to elders, families, and caregivers in the community. As a local agency, the Councils on Aging & Senior Centers serve as an elder advocate, offers services, and activities for elders. Council on Aging offerings may include Outreach, Transportation, Meals (congregate or home delivered), Health screenings, Health insurance counseling, Socialization, Fitness, wellness and recreation activities, Life-long learning. They serve as a link to and support for elders. Each Council on Aging determines its own priorities based on local needs and resources. Senior centers are a welcoming place for older adults who wish to remain independent in their community.

Cultural Council - (Two (2) vacancies)

Cultural Council members are appointed. The local Cultural Council supports public programs that promote access, education, diversity and excellence in the arts, humanities, and interpretive sciences in communities across the Commonwealth. Local decision-making is an integral element of this system. Local councils have the right and responsibility to award grants that address cultural needs specific to their communities, and they can decide how to distribute funds if the state policies outlined in these regulations and supplementary guidelines are followed. They meet 2-4 times per year.

Historical Commission (Two (2) vacancies)

The Historical Commission is charged with the preservation, protection, and development of the historical or archeological assets of the Town. As such, they make recommendations to the Select Board on matters relating to the preservation, protection and development of historic areas, buildings, structures, and sites. Further, it may acquire in the name of the Town by gift, purchase, grant, bequest, devise, and lease or otherwise the fee or lesser interest in real or personal property of significant historical value and may manage the same.

Planning Board Alternate (one (1) vacancy)

Planning Board Members are elected, but the alternate is an appointed position. The Planning Board is charged with overseeing and guiding development in the community. The Planning Board reviews permit applications for subdivisions and some special permits, and it is designated as the authority for Site Plan Review permits.

Zoning Board of Appeals (Two (2) vacancies)

The ZBA is charged with making Zoning text and zoning map interpretations, hearing appeals of administrative decisions, and to grant variances from ordinance standards where there is practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship meeting ordinance standards.

FALL 2023 "CLEAN SWEEP" BULKY WASTE RECYCLING DAY

Franklin County Solid Waste Management District is holding the Fall 2023 "Clean Sweep" Bulky Waste Recycling Day on Saturday, October 21 from 9 a.m. to noon. The three drop-off sites are: Mohawk Trail Regional School at 26 Ashfield Rd. (Route 112 South); Northfield Highway Garage at 49 Caldwell Rd; and Whately Transfer Station at 73 Christian Lane.

Residents from any of the District's 21 member towns may bring bulky items such as tires, appliances, scrap metal, furniture, carpeting, construction debris, computers, televisions, propane gas tanks, and other large items. Materials will be recycled whenever possible.

There are charges for most items. Disposal fees, cash only, will be collected during check-in at each site. A complete list of prices for the most common items is at: franklincountywastedistrict.org. The price list will also be provided to participating town halls and transfer stations. Residents and businesses do not need to pre-register for the collection.

Mattresses and box springs will not be accepted at this event. There are 6 regional mattress recycling locations across Franklin County. These sites are open various hours year-round. See this webpage for locations, pricing and hours: franklincountywastedistrict.org/mattress-recycling. If you are unsure if your mattress and box spring can be recycled, call the District office at 413-772-2438.

Electronics are accepted at the event, but residents are also encouraged to recycle computer equipment and televisions at their town's transfer station, or at Greenfield Transfer Station. Staples stores accept computer equipment (no TVs) free of charge: call store for details.

Clean, dry textiles and books will be accepted for free reuse or recycling. Textiles must be contained inside a sturdy plastic bag. Textiles are now banned from the trash in Massachusetts. Textile recycling accepts 95% of all textiles and shoes, including clothing or linens that are torn, stained, with missing buttons or broken zippers. Damaged textiles can be sold to manufacturers that make insulation or shop rags. Acceptable items include CLEAN & DRY clothing, shoes, and accessories; plus curtains, sheets, towels and stuffed animals in any condition (except moldy or wet). Books can be in any condition (except moldy or wet) and can be hardcover or paperback. No encyclopedias.

Bulky Rigid Plastics will be collected separately for a special recycling program; \$5 per load of acceptable items. This special recycling program only accepts these items: 5-gallon pails, plastic lawn furniture, plastic trash barrels, recycling bins, laundry baskets, storage totes, and milk crates. Bulky rigid plastic items must be empty.

Consider reuse: before sending items for disposal or recycling, see if someone else can use them. Various charities and non-profits accept donations of working electronics, including local Salvation Army and Goodwill stores. Always call ahead to ask if they can accept your item. Or, offer items for reuse on a local "Buy Nothing" Facebook group, Freecycle group, or local town groups such as NextDoor.

Notes from Your Conservation Commission

Our fall cleanup and trail workday is scheduled for October 14th with a rain date of the 21st. Individuals or groups who are available other times should check in with the Conservation Commission for specific needs. We are pushing thru a section of the White trail on top of Poplar Mtn so anyone.

Hunting season is coming up soon so dig out your Orange vests if you plan to be out in the woods. Hunting is permitted on state lands, many private properties, and the Poplar Mtn Conservation Area. We'll post the seasons on the kiosk at the parking area. They are also available online.

The conservation Commission is putting the final touches on a T-shirt for volunteers who work on our projects. Come work on Poplar Mtn and earn yourself one.

Poplar Mtn is finally surveyed. The weather this summer pushed back its completion but now we know when we are on our land and what projects we can complete and plan. First on that list is to complete the White Trail on top of the hill. Anyone who would like to spend part of a day on that project; don't wait for the workdays. Contact mark.blatchley@erving-ma.gov and I'll set you UP. We'll also be able to complete a few other pieces of trail work including new paths up top to the western side of the hill.

Permitting process

On a completely different topic. If you are planning any projects around your property; please check ahead about building permits and if there is any possible wetland nearby, the Conservation Commission. The state has established rule protecting the states waters and generally places responsibility for administering it with town Conservation Commissions. It is generally a straightforward process, and we are ready to help. Contact mark.blatchley@erving-ma.gov or Mariah in town hall.

What:

The leaf collection program is a free service for Erving residents. Leaves should be raked into piles along the curbside.

The Department begins collection on Erving-Side and will continue east through town. The Department works as quickly as possible, but depending on several factors, the collection could take up-to two (2) weeks to complete.

Important: The Department asks that residents ensure

that leaf piles **do not** include sticks, pet waste, garden waste, glass, or any other household waste. Piles that include these waste items will not be collected.



Sticks and other items can clog the collection unit and damage the equipment. Pet waste is a biological hazard that should be disposed of through other means. This collection is only for tree leaves.

Lastly, please do not block sidewalks, fire hydrants, or create piles in the roadway.

Safety Tips:

Bike helmets: Any person 16 years of age or younger operating a bicycle or being carried as a passenger on a bicycle on a public way, bicycle path, or on any other public right-of-way shall wear a helmet. Said helmet shall fit the person's head, shall be secured to the person's head by straps while the bicycle is being operated, and shall meet the standards for helmets established by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission. These requirements shall not apply to a passenger if the passenger is in an enclosed trailer or other device that adequately holds the passenger in place and protects the passenger's head from impact in an accident.

If you're in need of a helmet for a child, please contact the police department at 413-423-3310 ext. 1 so we may assist you.

Child Passenger Safety in Motor

vehicle: All children riding in passenger motor vehicles must be in a federally approved child passenger restraint that is properly fastened and secured until they are 8 years of age or over 57 inches tall. Children older than 8 years of age or taller than 57 inches must wear seat belts.




